Knowledge Building Blocks

Pupils will know that:-

Christians believe Jesus challenges everyone about how to live – he sets the example for loving God and putting your neighbour first.

Christians believe that Jesus challenges people who pretend to be good (hypocrisy) and shows love and forgiveness to unlikely people.

Christians try to be like Jesus – they want to know him better.

Christians try to put Jesus' teaching and example into practise in lots of way, from church worship to social justice.

To express our own ideas about religious beliefs and spirituality.

To show how religious beliefs affect people's lives.

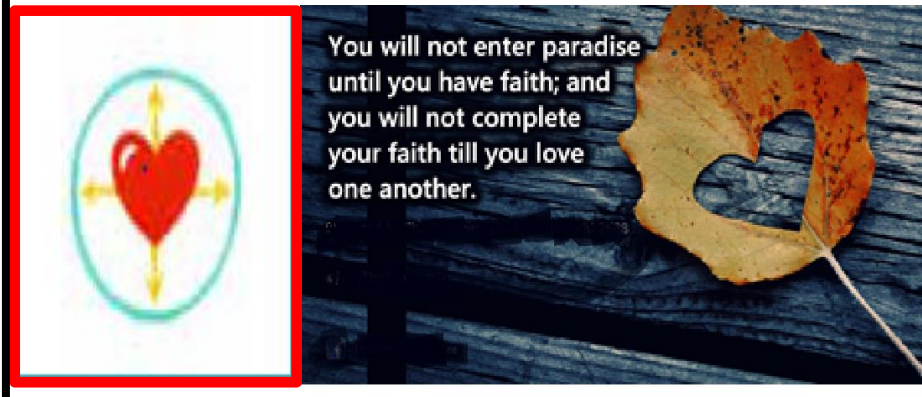

Subject Vocabulary

New Testament	The first part of the bible that tells stories that happened after Jesus was born.
Relationship	To be related or connected to someone or something.
Commands	Rules or orders.
Pharisee	A member of the ancient Jewish church.
Tax collector	Someone who collects money to give to the 'leader'.
Gospel	The first four books of the New Testament – Matthew, Mark, Luke and John that tell the Good News of Jesus.
Parables	A short story to teach a religious truth. E.G <i>The Good Samaritan</i>
Humility	Having a low view of one's importance
Disciples	Jesus chose 12 men to help him during his 3 year mission to teach people The Good News.
Christian	People who believe in Jesus and follow the teaching of Jesus from the bible.
Leprosy	An infectious disease. Christians believe that Jesus healed people with this illness.

Restore	To bring the relationship between God and humans close after the Fall through Jesus.
Devote	To commit to serving God than one's self.
Insight	Ability to have a clear, deep and sometimes sudden understanding of a situation.
