Knowledge Building Blocks

Pupils will know that:

- Christians believe God has 3 parts - a Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Christians worship God as Trinity.
- Christians believe The Father creates; he sends the Son who saves his people; the Son sends the Holy Spirit to his followers.
- Christians find that understanding God is challenging; people spend their whole lives learning more and more about God.
- Christians really want to try to understand God better and so try to describe God using symbols, similes and metaphors, in song, story, poems and art.
- Christians believe the Holy Spirit is God's power at work in the world and in their lives today, enabling them to follow Jesus.

Key Skills

- To use clips and art to make sense of stories.
- To reflect on prayer through poetry and art.
- To be able to compare and contrast (eg child and adult baptism.)
- To develop skills of listening and thinking about what people believe.
- To express our own ideas about religious beliefs and spirituality.
- To keep an open mind about how we feel.
- To use computing research about religious beliefs and actions.
- To talk about and discuss how religious beliefs affect people's lives.

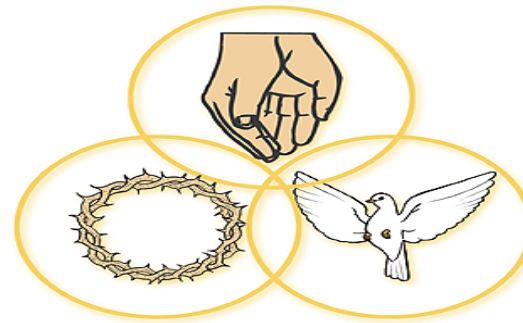
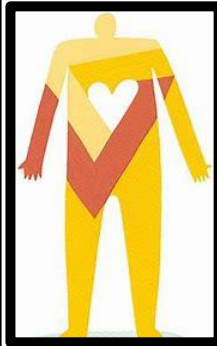

Key Knowledge

- I can identify the difference between a 'Gospel', which tells the story of Jesus' life and teaching and a letter or message to others.
- I can explain what texts about baptism and Trinity might mean. giving examples of what these texts mean to Christians today.
- I can describe how Christians show their beliefs about God the Trinity in worship (in baptism and prayer, for example) and in the way they live.
- I can make links between Bible texts and the idea of God in Christianity.
- I can clearly express some ideas of my own about what the God of Christianity is like.

Subject Vocabulary

Creator	Someone who makes things. Christians believe the world was created by God and is a creator.
Holy	To be seen as deserving special respect/reverence.
Almighty/ Omnipotent	God having the power to see and do everything.
Fortress	A strong tower. Used as an image of God's strength.
Rock	A solid stone. Used as an image that God is strong
Saviour	Christians believe Jesus is the saviour – to save humans from danger/sin.
Rabbi	A teacher in the Jewish faith.
Covenant	An agreement or promise.
Christian	People who believe in Jesus and follow the teaching of Jesus from the bible.
Prophet	A person who is believed to have a special power that allows them to say messages from God
Holy Spirit	Often described in the bible as wind, fire, breath, dove, water, comforter.
Baptism	An act of faith and obedience to the commands of Christ

Spirituality	To have a relationship with God.
Symbol	An object or picture that represents something else.
Concept	An abstract idea e.g The Trinity,
Transform	To change the character of someone.
