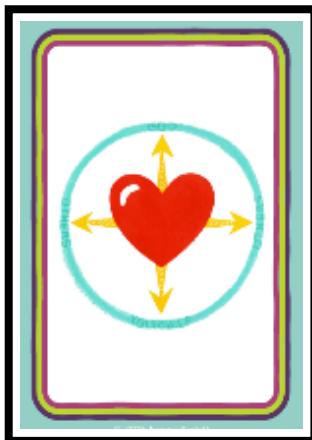

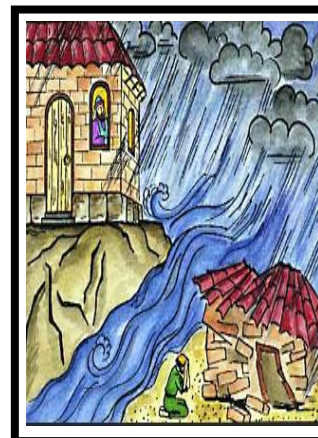

### KEY KNOWLEDGE TAUGHT

BY THE END OF THIS UNIT, PUPILS ARE EXPECTED TO KNOW / BE ABLE TO:

- Place concept cards for The people of God on the Big frieze and explain the why they are there.
- Know some stories from the gospels and understand their meanings and possible interpretations. (parables, narratives)
- Christians see that Jesus' teachings and example cut across expectations — the Sermon on the Mount is an example of this, where Jesus' values favour serving the weak and vulnerable, not making people comfortable.
- Recognise that Gospel texts ,are 'good news' about Jesus and that Christians aim to live following these values in community and in their individual lives.
- Relate biblical ideas, teachings or beliefs (eg peace, forgiveness, healing) to the issues, problems and opportunities of their own lives and community in the world today,

## Vocabulary

<b>Gospels</b>	comes from the Anglo-Saxon godspell, meaning "good tidings," or bringing good news, and the good news itself The four gospels in the Bible are Matthew, Mark, Luke and John in the New Testament
<b>sermon</b>	a talk on a religious or moral subject, especially one given during a church service and based on a passage from the Bible.
<b>meeek</b>	quiet, gentle, and easily imposed on; submissive.
<b>community</b>	a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common
<b>Interpretation:</b>	Ways of explaining the meaning of something.
